a. Discussion and possible action regarding participation in the 2015 League of Arizona Cities and Towns Annual Conference and Youth Program


The Youth Advisory Commission has been invited to attend the 2015 League of Arizona Cities and Towns Youth Program Annual Conference in Tucson August 19th. The costs for the commission attendees are covered by the City of Kingman. Attendees will be asked to stay through the last 2 1/2 hours prior to participating in the Tri-City Council's Showcase of Cities and Towns on August 20th. The duration of the trip will be August 19th through August 21st and transportation and meals are provided. The commission will discuss commissioner availability to attend and participate in the League Youth Program.

b. Discussion and possible action considering a community project to be taken on by the Youth Advisory Commission

The Youth Advisory Commission helps organize the annual Badges of Courage Basketball Game each year. The funds raised by the commission have been utilized for community projects in the past. The commission will discuss ideas for a new community project to utilize the funds from the most recent game.

c. Discussion and possible action considering revision of the ordinance governing the Youth Advisory Commission

Due to limited availability of commissioners during the summer months, when school is not in session, staff is seeking input from the commission on whether it would like to "go dark" and not hold meetings during the months of June and July. If direction is given to proceed, staff will put together a formal ordinance to reflect this and bring it back to the commission to make a recommendation to Council.
